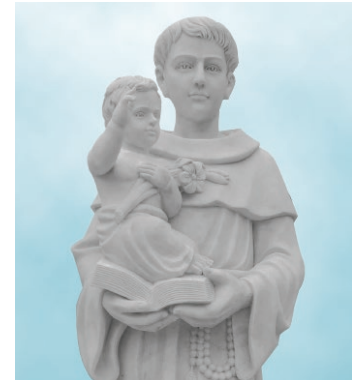
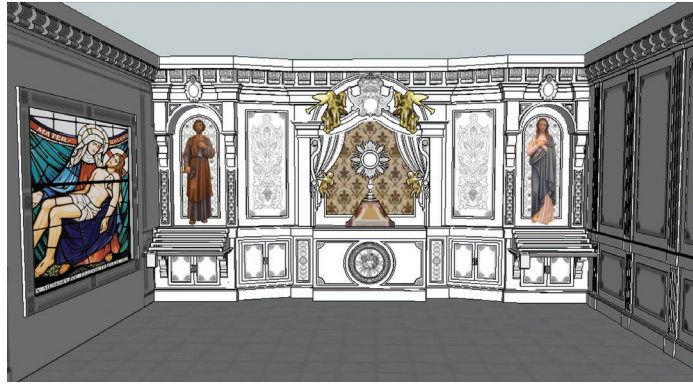
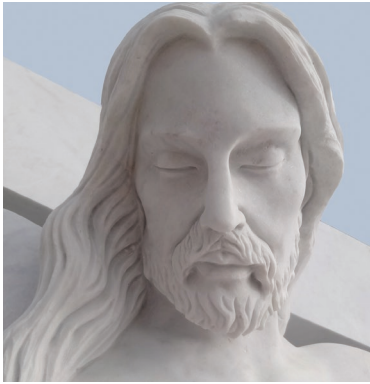


Church of St. Pius X Renovation – Phase II

Bringing our Vision to Life

The Church of St. Pius X is ready to begin the second and final phase of its total renovation named “*Bringing Our Vision to Life*,” which was split into parts to manage the costs of construction. Phase II (“the Narthex/Entrance”) will improve the accessibility, appearance, and security of the Church building, as well as provide new prayer spaces in and around the building. Phase II includes a handicapped-accessible, covered entrance to the new Church from the parking lot, new religious education offices, a chapel dedicated to Mary, and improvements to the grounds. There will be no interruption in Mass Schedule or location during construction.

Architectural plans have been completed and approved by the Village of Scarsdale and a contractor has been selected through a competitive bidding process. If the remaining funds are successfully raised and the necessary permits are issued promptly, construction will begin immediately and will be completed by the 60th Anniversary of our Parish in 2014.

The Narthex

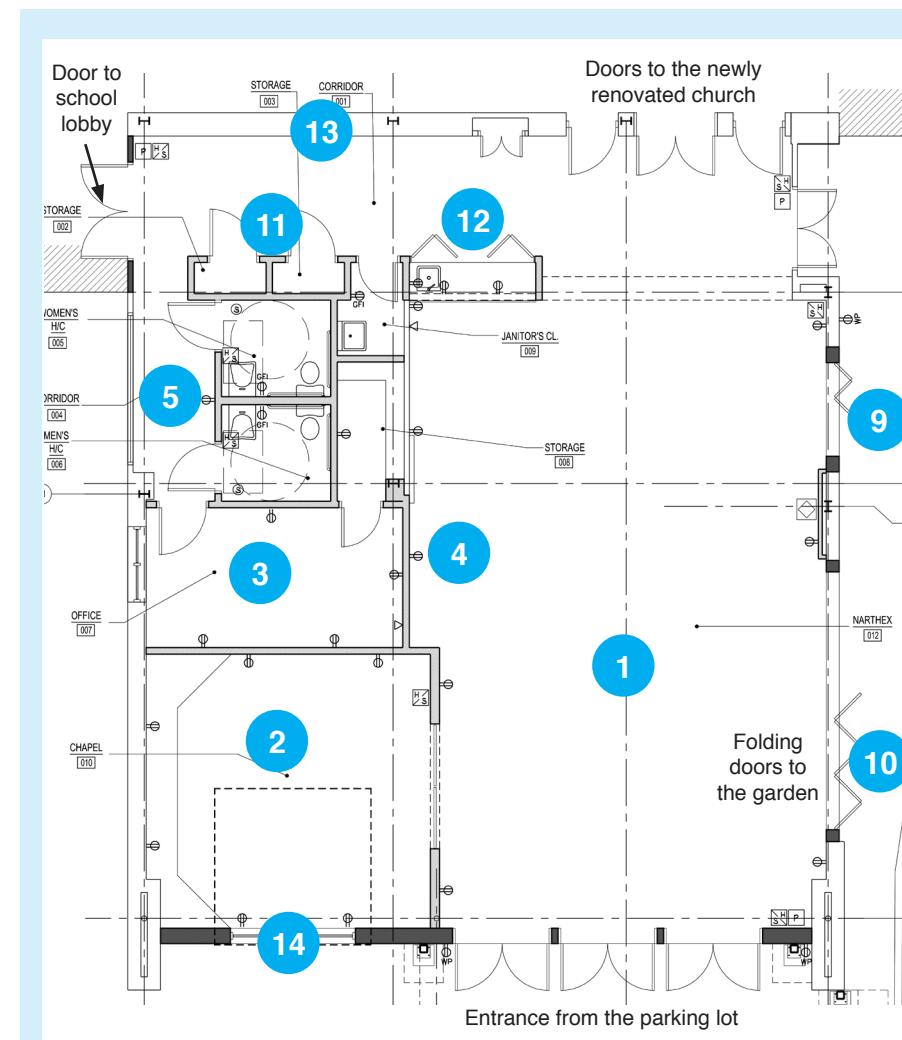
1. Gathering Space with facilities to accommodate receptions (such as the one after our ever-growing Family Mass) and provide overflow seating for times of high occupancy in the Church.
2. Prayer Chapel to Mary that will also be a bridal waiting area.
3. Religious Education Offices.
4. Glass Memorial Wall, that will display the history of our Parish and list the founding donors to the original Church and the donors to both phases of the renovation.
5. New bathrooms.

6. Separate Entrance – The Narthex will separate and secure the school building from the Church. This is required by modern safety standards to secure the children while attending classes.
7. Bell Tower – There will be a modern interpretation of a “bell tower” where the statue of St. Pius X, our patron saint, will be enshrined and stand welcoming parishioners as they enter the Church.
8. Covered Drop Off Area and Handicapped Accessible Entrance.
9. Meditation Garden – The blacktop outside the original entrance to the Church facing Palmer Avenue will be replaced with plantings and lawn to form an outdoor meditation garden with marble statues of Saints Anthony, Francis of Assisi and Therese of the Little Flower and seating. A circle within the meditation garden, visible from the Narthex, will contain marble statues of Mary and Saint John the Beloved standing below a life-size marble crucifix.
10. Walking Devotional – The Stations of the Cross from the original Church will be housed in individual structures along our property for a walking devotional simulating a pilgrimage to the Holy Land.

Cast Stone Station of the Cross on a Mahogany stand (8), each \$8,500

- First Station: Jesus is condemned to death
- Second Station: Jesus carries His cross (Reserved)
- Third Station: Jesus falls the first time
- Fourth Station: Jesus meets His mother (Reserved)
- Fifth Station: Simon of Cyrene helps Jesus to carry the cross (Reserved)
- Sixth Station: Veronica wipes the face of Jesus (Reserved)
- Seventh Station: Jesus falls the second time
- Eighth Station: Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem (Reserved)
- Ninth Station: Jesus falls the third time
- Tenth Station: Jesus is stripped of His garments
